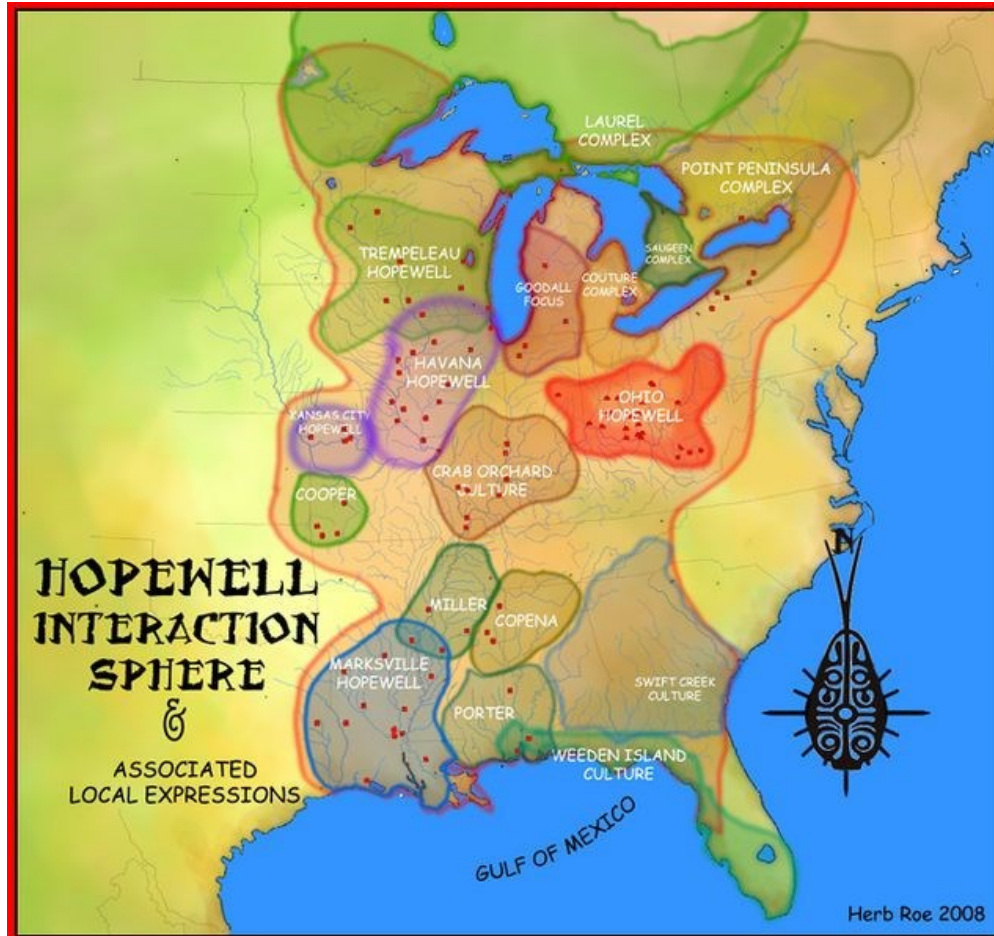




Hopewell Interaction Sphere



The Hopewell Interaction Sphere extended from the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico and from the Missouri River to the Appalachian Mountains.

Groups of people exchanged cultural traditions, technology, and materials.

Locally, the people in Louisa County are classified as the Havana Hopewell Tradition and interacted closely with people in Mississippi and Illinois River Valleys.

Artifacts made with exotic materials such as marine shells, copper, mica, pearls, obsidian and more were found at Toolesboro National Historic Builders participated in trade within the Hopewell Interaction Sphere.
